- The Maritime Safety Committee, at its seventy-seventh session (28 May to 6 June 2003), agreed that the unified interpretation set forth in the annex to MSC/Circ.1075 contained appropriate guidance for the competent authorities acting in accordance with chapter 7.9 of the IMDG Code when granting exemptions not specifically covered under the approvals, permits, certificates and other authorizations already provided for by the provisions of chapter 7.9.
- A communication has been received from the Government of the Republic of Lithuania informing the Organization that the Republic of Lithuania has completed its legal internal procedures necessary for the entry into force of the Memorandum of Understanding for the Transport of Packaged Dangerous Goods in Ro/Ro Ships in the Baltic Sea.
