**INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION ON CIVIL LIABILITY FOR  
OIL POLLUTION DAMAGE, 1969**

**Denunciation by Djibouti, Sierra Leone, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines,  
Cameroon, Qatar and Brunei Darussalam**

The Secretary-General of the International Maritime Organization has the honour to refer to article XVI of the International Convention on Civil Liability for Oil Pollution Damage, 1969, by the terms of which a Contracting State may denounce the Convention at any time after its entry into force for that State, by depositing an instrument with the Secretary-General of the Organization.

The Secretary-General has the honour to state that, in accordance with article XVI, paragraph 2 denunciation by the following Contracting States was effected by deposit of instruments on the dates indicated:

Brunei Darussalam	31 January 2002	31 January 2003

In accordance with article XVI, paragraph 3, the denunciations will take effect for the States concerned on the dates indicated above.
