**INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION ON CIVIL LIABILITY FOR
OIL POLLUTION DAMAGE, 1969**

Denunciation by Slovenia, Morocco and Papua New Guinea

The Secretary-General of the International Maritime Organization has the honour to refer to article XVI of the International Convention on Civil Liability for Oil Pollution Damage, 1969, by the terms of which a Contracting State may denounce the Convention at any time after its entry into force for that State, by depositing an instrument with the Secretary-General of the Organization.

The Secretary-General has the honour to state that, in accordance with article XVI, paragraph 2 denunciation by the following Contracting States was effected by deposit of instruments on the dates indicated:

	Date of deposit of instrument	Date of entry into force
Republic of Slovenia	19 July 2000	19 July 2001
Kingdom of Morocco	25 October 2000	25 October 2001
Papua New Guinea	23 January 2001	23 January 2002

In accordance with article XVI, paragraph 3, the denunciations took effect for the States concerned on the dates indicated above.
