## PREVENTION OF POLLUTION OF THE SEA BY AGENTS OTHER THAN OIL

THE ASSEMBLY,

NOTING the participation of the IMCO Secretariat in the ACC Sub-Committee on Oceanography, in particular as regards the preparation and distribution to governments of a questionnaire on pollution of the sea by agents other than oil as a first step to clarifying the various aspects of the problem,

RECOGNIZING ALSO that any international control of pollution of the sea may have a bearing on the freedom and efficiency of shipping,

REQUESTS the Secretary-General to co-operate, as appropriate, with the international organizations concerned with respect to the investigation, prevention and control of pollution of the sea by agents other than oil with special regard to those aspects of the problem which may imply any limitations on the freedom and efficiency of shipping.

## IMPLEMENTATION OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS ON TREATMENT OF SHELTER-DECK AND OTHER 'OPEN' SPACES

THE ASSEMBLY,

RECALLING its Resolution A.48(III) concerning the Recommendations on the treatment of shelter-deck and other 'open' spaces,

TAKING NOTE that, in accordance with the terms of that Resolution, the Maritime Safety Committee, at its eighth session, approved the details of the tonnage mark table, the form and position of the tonnage mark and definition of the uppermost and second decks,

HAVING EXAMINED the report of the Maritime Safety Committee (MSC X/36, paragraphs 54-56) which was transmitted to the Assembly by the Council in accordance with Article 22(a) of the IMCO Convention,

BEARING IN MIND the recommendations to governments to include in their national tonnage measurement requirements, provisions to give effect to the Recommendations,

NOTING that certain countries have already taken steps to give effect to the Recommendations,

REQUESTS governments which have not yet implemented those Recommendations to give consideration to so doing.
