5. For the accreditation of other members of the Permanent Mission, it is sufficient to address a letter to the Secretary-General signed by the Permanent Representative, referring to the instructions received from the Government to this effect. In the case of persons who are not or will not be accredited to the Government of the United Kingdom and persons who are citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies or permanently resident in the United Kingdom, the procedure described in paragraph 2 above shall be followed.

HEADQUARTERS FACILITIES AND ACCOMMODATION

THE ASSEMBLY,

RECALLING resolution A.402(X) referring to the Declaration of Intent between IMCO and the United Kingdom Government on the new Headquarters building,

RECALLING ALSO resolution A.460(XI) on loans for financing installation costs in the new Headquarters building,

NOTING that several Member States have offered a financial gift, loan or credit facility to assist in meeting installation expenditure,

NOTING FURTHER the continued progress with regard to the construction of the new Headquarters premises and installation of furniture, furnishings and equipment,

EXPRESSES its deep gratitude:

- (a) To the host Government for the high priority which it has continued to accord to the new Headquarters project and for agreeing to financial arrangements favourable to IMCO;
- (b) To the Governments of Japan, Saudi Arabia, the USSR, France, Kuwait, India and Greece for their most generous support in financing installation in the new Headquarters premises by way of a financial gift, loan or credit facility;
- (c) To the Secretary-General for his personal efforts to obtain support for installation expenditure, to ensure progress on the construction and equipping of the new building and to negotiate favourable financial arrangements with the host Government.
