

TAKING INTO ACCOUNT ALSO that one of the objectives and principles of the Charter of the United Nations is that of safeguarding peace and international security, and that its Members will abstain from resorting to threat or use of force against any other State in order to solve a dispute (Article 1.1 and Article 2.3 of the said Charter),

CONDEMNS any act not in accordance with the rules and principles of international law and the Charter of the United Nations which might place in danger human lives and safety at sea, and risk the safety of maritime navigation.

RELATIONS WITH NON-GOVERNMENTAL INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

THE ASSEMBLY,

TAKING NOTE of Part XII of the Convention on the Inter-Governmental Maritime Consultative Organization and in particular Article 48,

RECALLING that Rule 1 of the Rules Governing Relationship with Non-Governmental International Organizations requires that the Assembly approve consultative status granted by the Council to such organizations,

RECALLING FURTHER that Rule 10 of the same Rules provides for periodic review of the list of non-governmental international organizations in consultative status with IMCO and a report to the Assembly on the continuation of such status,

HAVING CONSIDERED the request of the Council at its twenty-eighth, twenty-ninth, and seventh extraordinary, sessions to approve the grant of consultative status to the following, as bodies which are able to make a substantial contribution to the work of the Organization:

RESOLUTION A.313(VIII)

CONTINUATION OF THE JOINT INSPECTION UNIT

THE ASSEMBLY,

CONSIDERING that the United Nations General Assembly has decided, in its Resolution 2924 (XXVII), that the Joint Inspection Unit should continue in being for a further period of four years beyond 31 December 1973 and has recommended the other participating organizations in the United Nations system to take appropriate action for the continuation of the Joint Inspection Unit and the use of its services on the basis set out in this Resolution, and

NOTING that the United Nations General Assembly will review, at its thirty-first session, the machinery of the United Nations and of its system for administrative and budgetary control, investigation and co-ordination, taking into account, *inter alia*, the views of the governing bodies of the Specialized Agencies,

DECIDES that the Inter-Governmental Maritime Consultative Organization shall continue to participate in the Joint Inspection Unit for a further period of four years beyond 31 December 1973 on the basis set out in General Assembly Resolution 2924 (XXVII).
